<u>Curriculum</u>

Please find attached our curriculum information sheet taking us up to February half term. Our Creative Curriculum supports the New National Curriculum Year 4 programmes of study for Science, Art and Design, Computing, Design and Technology, Geography, History, Languages (French), Music and Physical Education. As part of our commitment to promoting children's spiritual, moral and cultural development, our curriculum also includes Religious Education and PSHE (personal, social, health and economic education).

Literacy

In Eagles, this half term one of our main focuses in literacy is dictation of sentences. This will support them in constructing sentences that are grammatically correct. It would be fantastic if you could support your child with this at home. This could be with their home spellings by dictating sentences using the spellings.

Learning Enrichment Activities

There are a number of PE activities planned for the children this term in addition to our twice weekly PE lessons. The activities include the sports hall athletics festival, gymnastics festival and swimming festival as well as dance and gymnastics coaching sessions. Forest Schools

This term the children are taking part in forest schools. They will be enjoying a range activities including fire building. Please remember to provide your child with approprioare warm clothing, including footwear.

Learning at Home

We expect children in Year Four to be completing <u>one hour</u> of homework each week. Children in Eagles are expected to complete the following Learning at Home on a <u>weekly</u> basis:

- Reading at home: daily (5 minutes each time)
- Home Maths book (multiplication and division facts): 3 times a week (5 minutes each time)
- MyMaths task (maximum 10 minutes)
- Home Spelling book: 3 times a week (5 minutes each time)
- Learning Log activities (optional)
