Spellings

A new <u>Home Spellings Book 2</u> will be sent home for your child to complete. Book 2 contains 'Common Exception Words' for Year 2 which your child will be assessed against, as part of the national assessments for Key Stage One. Please continue to learn these spellings <u>three times</u> <u>a week</u>. The home spellings will be checked regularly at school to check their progress. I will highlight the words your child has spelt correctly at the back of the spelling book.

<u>Spelling Book 2</u> will be sent home every <u>Monday</u> and should be returned on the <u>Friday</u>.

Mathematics

Maths homework will now be split into <u>two</u> different tasks, set alternatively on Monday's and are due in the <u>following</u> <u>Monday</u>.

<u>MyMaths:</u> the first MyMaths homework was set on the <u>8th January</u> and will continue to be set on alternate Monday's from this date.

Home Maths Book: multiplication/division facts and arithmetic questions will now be sent home in the children's yellow Home Maths Book on alternate weeks to their MyMaths tasks. Please encourage your child to use different methods to help them answer the calculations (mental strategies are given in the book). The Home Maths Book will be sent home on the 15th of January.

Reading

Reading books will be checked daily and changed when necessary. Please ensure your child has their book in school every day. A reminder that the children earn a tick/stamp towards a reading reward every time they read three or more times per week. I would encourage you to help the progression of your child's reading by asking them questions about the book regularly; examples of questions can be found in your child's reading record.
