Important Information about the 'Schools for the Future'

Central Bedfordshire is an area that will grow. Up to 43,000 new homes are expected by 2035. This means that the local authority needs to plan for school places.

The local authority already have a plan for school places on a five-year basis but given this scale of growth, they need a longerterm, strategic plan for education across the whole of Central Bedfordshire for the next 15 – 20 years. They have been working closely with all schools to ensure that they can provide **the right school places**, **in the right locations**, **delivering the best education**.

Schools now have more freedoms to change their age range. Around a quarter of schools in Central Bedfordshire have done so which means we now have a very complex mixture of schools. Central Bedfordshire has historically been a three-tier school system with lower, middle and upper schools. However, this has been changing more recently as schools have changed the age range they cater for, effectively becoming a primary or secondary school. Most of the UK operates on a two-tier school system with primary and secondary schools.

Houghton Conquest has a business plan with the aim to become a Primary School with potentially our first Year 5 intake in September 2019 with Year 6 in September 2020. We are working with our local schools and the local authority to enable this to be successful, competitive and attractive proposition to all parents and pupils.

We understand that the current mixture of schools is confusing and changes taking place can create problems for parents. We will be doing our best to keep you informed of the changes in Central Bedfordshire.

Currently Central Bedfordshire Council (CBC) are working with each cluster (groups of schools organised geographically) to help create local plans detailing how we meet future school places that will be required to meet our housing growth. Our school is in the Cranfield Cluster but we also work alongside the Wootton Pyramid of Schools (because this historically has been our main feeder route through via Marston Vale and then onto Wootton Upper School). These schools are in Bedford Borough.

The CBC plans will include details of where schools may expand, where any new schools will be built and the structure of schools in the local area. Once they are completed and where any change is identified, we will work with the local schools **to consult** widely so that current and future generations of parents have the opportunity to inform future plans. The latest information to report from CBC is:

'Taking the area as a whole, the programme has established that a clear majority of schools have either already converted to primary / secondary schools, want to change their age range to this model, or are open to exploring a change to a primary / secondary or an extended secondary model.'
