Owls Stoke Bruerne Visit

Owls class had an exciting day at Stoke Bruerne. Children had an opportunity to open and close the lock gates. This was a wonderful experience for the children to understand more about man-made waterways and how they managed the hilly countryside. The children also got to learn more about canal life in the museum and learnt about the clothing the children would have worn, and some children even had the opportunity to dress up!

We would particularly like to thank our volunteers for the day who did a fantastic job in leading a group of children and ensuring they had a fun and safe time at the canal.







On Monday Helen and Erika from the Greensand Trust visited school for an assembly about the ways animals prepare for winter called HONK, HUDDLE & SNORE. We learnt about one special animal that hibernates, the Dormouse.

Dormice make beautiful round woven nests of leaves, bark strips and grasses about the size of a tennis ball. The nests are sometimes visible this time of year in hedgerows, or tucked in brambles or bushes. A few of the children helped weave a giant Dormouse nest that has been created by a local craftsperson, and is being added to by schoolchildren from several schools on the Greensand Ridge as part of the 'Learning through the Landscape' project. The nest will be featured in a Greensand Country Festival in May 2018.

Dormice are endangered in Britain and legally protected but there are some local woodlands where dormice are known to live so maybe there are more.

They are very shy creatures and difficult to monitor and record so if you think you have seen a Dormouse nest Helen and Erika asked that you don't touch it but take a photograph and let them know. info@greensandtrust.org
