Forest School

There has been some amazing den building occurring using the various things in and around our newly fenced area! Hay bales, long tree branches, string and rope...the creative juices have been flowing in all our different age groups. They should all be proud of the teamwork and effort they exhibit.

Fire-lighting proved tricky for some of the children. However, they persevered and eventually all in our Year 4 group lit their very first fire using a flint and steel! Many of the skills the children learn in forest school require patience, perseverance and self-belief. Their resilience grows each time they practise something new and their self-esteem



brims to its fullest when they successfully accomplish the task at hand. It is always wonderful to see their smiling faces and the encouragement they also share with one another after seeing each person's successes.

A big thank you, again, to the Williamson family who assisted us in putting up the beautiful willow hurdle fencing which creates safe boundaries for all the children. We just need to install the three gate entrances, and then the area should be complete. I hope to celebrate this occurrence with an official Forest School opening where all parents and children from our school will be invited to view the area and even try out some of the tasks that the children will be doing in their sessions each year as they progress throughout the school.

The children love to have parent guests at their sessions where they can show off what they are doing. So if you are able to join us to help out at a session from 1-3 p.m. (Tues, Wed or Thurs) even if it is only one time, I strongly encourage you to do so - please let the school office or myself know if you are available. Feedback regarding recent Survey

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete our recent survey regarding the possibility of Houghton Conquest Lower School becoming a primary school in the future. We received 46 responses.

The overall feedback about becoming a primary school was very positive. However, although parents, particularly year 4 parents, would definitely choose to stay at the school through years 5 and 6, parents were concerned about investment in facilities for upper KS2 (years 5 and 6). Parents like the idea of primary rather than the transitions that have to take place because of the 3 tier system.

Unfortunately, in Central Bedfordshire there has been no funding to build or transform into a primary school, whereas Bedford Borough did grant their schools additional funding. We will be presenting your feedback to our cluster of schools and to Central Bedfordshire Education Department for consideration. This would be to highlight your views and wishes for the future for your child's education in this area.

If you missed the survey but have something important to add, please email the school by 8am on Monday, 29th January. We will be taking your responses (anonymous) to a meeting on Monday at 10am to the rest of our lower schools in this area. On the 6th February we will be continuing discussion with all schools (middle and upper) in the Wootton Pyramid.

Perform Workshop Doves Class – The Great Fire of London



Our workshop began with a visit from Samuel Pepys, the diarist of the Great Fire of London. He invited us to join him in his time capsule and head back to 1666, where we found Thomas Farrynor, baker to the King, in his bakery on Pudding Lane. After a long day's baking, Thomas was keen to head to bed and accidentally left one of his ovens alight – and so began the Great Fire of London!

Through movement and sound, we imagined the fire and how it would have spread through the close wooden houses of the city. We imagined what we would bury to save from the fire – PS4s and iPads first and foremost! We visited St Paul's Cathedral and heard how the fire burnt it to the ground, smashing the stained glass windows and melting the lead on the roof.

In the grand finale, the whole class took a role in acting out the story of the Great Fire of London, from Thomas Farrynor's early night through to the re-building of the city.

The children were exceptionally well behaved throughout the workshop and thoroughly engaged with the story. They have produced some excellent work in class following the workshop, that you will have the opportunity to see at the upcoming Parent Consultations.
