# A reminder of an article regarding the pirate ship that was included in newsletter 3.

## Use of the pirate ship out of school hours

Following the change to the end of school collection arrangements last term, we have noticed over time that the number of children using the pirate ship out of school hours has greatly increased. Whilst it is wonderful to see our pirate ship being used by so many children (under direct parent supervision), we do need to be mindful of the risks involved.

The pirate ship has been built and designed for children aged **4-10 year olds under direct adult supervision, with a maximum of 20 children at any one time**. If we allow school children to use the pirate ship out of school hours under parental supervision it is very difficult to stop younger siblings also using it. Consideration also needs to be given to the weather conditions, as the pirate ship should not be used in wet conditions or if it is wet following dew or rain.

With all of this in mind, the pirate ship should <u>not</u> be used by <u>any</u> children, out of school hours **until further notice.** Thank you for your cooperation.
