Quick Update

Bake Sale

As parental contributions to this opportunity fell a little short, we were asked if we could fund the difference, which we agreed to, at a cost of £117. I really hope the school continues with additional sessions like this from time to time, to help make learning more fun.

Each year the school puts together a leavers yearbook to give to our year 4 children when they leave us in July - we have examples of them in the school reception area if you would like to look at one or two.

The children really appreciate having something to take away to remind them of their time at Houghton Conquest Lower School, so the Friends will be supporting the yearbooks again this year.
