- The Key Stage One national assessments will commence at any time during the month of <u>May.</u>
- We are looking forward to a visit around Houghton Conquest to identify trees. The provisional date booked is for the afternoon of the <u>16th May, with an alternative date of the 23rd</u> <u>May</u>.
- Sports day will be on <u>Tuesday 27th June</u> in the morning with the alternative date of <u>Thursday 3rd July</u> (if the first date is postponed due to weather).
- Towards the end of the summer term the children will begin their transition into year 3 and will spend the day as a Year 3 on Tuesday 17th July.

Learning Enrichment Activities

Over the course of the term, Owls children will be making a fruit smoothie in Design Technology. Therefore, it is essential that you ensure the office are aware of any medical needs your child has and inform them of any new medical requirements promptly.

Our Stunning Start afternoons have begun, where the children are given opportunities to clear weeds, prepare the ground and plant some seeds. They will also have time to explore the school grounds and discuss what they see.

Spellings

Please continue to learn the spellings <u>three times a</u> <u>week</u>. The home spellings will be checked regularly at school to check their progress. I will highlight the words your child has spelt correctly at the back of the spelling book.

Mathematics

Many children have been excelling through their multiplication/division tests as a result of your support at home and are confident in their knowledge of multiplication and division.

Please continue to complete the maths homework, remembering that the maths homework alternates weekly. The week commencing the 30^{th} of April, a MyMaths task will be set, and the following week, the 7^{th} of May, a maths task will be set in their Home Maths Book. This will help to support your child in preparation for the tests which they will be completing in May.

Reading

Reading books will be checked daily and changed when necessary. <u>Please ensure</u> your child has their book in school every day. A reminder that the children earn a tick/stamp towards a reading reward every time they read <u>three or more times per week</u>. Encourage your child to refer to the text when answering questions. Comprehension and understanding of texts is assessed during the May 2018 assessments and your support at home does make a huge difference.
