RE: Keeping in touch

As you will be aware, throughout the past three weeks we have been continuing to welcome back different pupils from across the school into our bubble groups and have even formed a new 'bubble group' this week. Our Robins and Doves groups have now also been back with us for almost three weeks and have settled incredibly well and it is starting to feel like 'normal'. We are extremely proud of all of our children for their response to the changes and continued safety measures in place.

As guidance and government announcements continue to change in the wider world on an almost daily basis, all of our plans always remain provisional and adaptable to change. One such change we have found is that many more families are being requested or needed back at work, and therefore, the number of Key Worker children in school is increasing.

We are finding that we will soon become oversubscribed for places within these groups and, as government and local authority guidelines dictate, we must prioritise children from Key Worker *(as defined by the Government)* families for provision ahead of any specific eligible year groups. As a result of this increasing demand, alongside this guidance, we may have to continuously adapt the provision we are currently offering.

Wider re-opening of school

The Government have acknowledged that for many schools, given the strict preventative measures to reduce infection, wider re-opening to more pupils may not be possible before the summer holidays.

It is with great sadness that we now also find ourselves unable to plan to increase our offer to any other year groups in the near future due to our limited classroom space, staffing and toilet facilities. We will of course continue to do everything we can to support those children still learning from home and hope you will continue to contact us should you need any further guidance or support.















Transition

We do hope to invite our year 4 children into school for a short length of time in a small socially distanced bubble to say goodbye to their teachers and peers during the last week of term. We are very sad that this will not be the end of school celebration that the children and parents were hoping for; more details will be shared about this in a separate letter in due course.

For children who are joining us in September we are currently putting together a 'getting to know us' booklet which introduces you to our staff and school setting. We are also compiling a list of frequently asked questions which we hope will answer any queries or questions you may have. Once these are completed we will share them with you. Our pre-school staff are also putting together a 'school readiness board' to help inform the children who are in pre-school.

A message for all

With these changes in mind it is important to highlight that, with current restrictions and guidance in place; we reiterate that we are almost working at our absolute full capacity. If at any time we lose a member of staff due to illness or any other personal reason we will need to close the bubble for this group until staff members are able to return.

Home learning

Thank you so much for continuing to support your child's learning from home. Some children may be coming to the end of their home learning pack; if this is the case and you would like a new home learning pack, then please see information below about when to collect it from school.

However, if you are still continuing with the home learning pack you already have, please continue to do so and you can get in contact with your class teacher if and when you would like to access the new home learning pack. We are more than happy to facilitate what is best for you and your family, as I am aware every household has their own demands and we do not wish to add any extra pressure.

If your child/ren are <u>not attending school</u> and you would like another home learning pack they will be available to collect next week (see table below). If you would like to receive your pack via email, please email your child's class email address to state your preference.

The home learning packs will be labelled and on a table in the designated area for you to collect. This will run across two separate days if you are unable to get to the school on the first day.
