Contact Track and Tracing

Given the reduced numbers currently on school sites, the Department for Education expects contact tracing activity to be reduced over half-term for schools, however, contact tracing remains vitally important in the continued, national effort to limit the spread of the virus.

Where pupils or staff members attending their setting test positive for coronavirus, **having developed symptoms within 48 hours of being in the setting**, the school is asked to assist in identifying close contacts and advising self-isolation, as the individual may have been infectious whilst in the setting.

If you, therefore, fall into this category over the half term holiday please email head@hcschool.org.uk to inform us of the positive COVID-19 test result.

Where pupils or staff members attending their setting test positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) during the holidays, having developed symptoms more than 48 hours since being in the setting, the setting is not required to take any action. Staff, parents, and carers should follow contact tracing instructions provided by NHS Test and Trace.

Central Bedfordshire Council have put together a useful 1 page summary guide to self-isolation - we have put a copy on our website for you to access.

Preschool and Robins Key Worker Bubble Update
