Learning Enrichment Activities

The new term began with an exciting delivery in our classroom. The children had to guess what story the props and pictures related to. They guessed correctly when they saw the beans and beanstalk. They acted out the story using props, costumes and learned a new song. We looked at seeds, discussed how to plant and nurture them. They are looking forward to making a cress sandwich with our cress plants once they have grown. Lots of creative activities from 3d castle building, castle brick printing, fairytale dances, potion making and creating a cookbook for the Giant. In Maths, we measured and compared length and height of objects using cubes and Giant feet. We discussed the characters and settings of the story and what could be at the top of our beanstalk. We also discussed the magic harp and what magical object they woud like.

<u>PE</u>

Our PE lesson is on <u>Tuesday afternoon</u>, and therefore your child will be required to have their PE kit in school on this day. Tricky Words/Little Wandle Phonics Book

<u>Tricky Words</u> - Please can your child practise their Tricky Words to support their reading? These will be read in school on alternate weeks and new words given, once confident. Once children have learnt their Tricky Words, they will be learning to write them and use them in a sentence.

Learning Logs

Learning Logs

We are enjoying sharing our Learning Logs with our friends. They play an important part in supporting children's confidence, communication and language skills, fine motor skills and practise their segmenting to write words and sentences.

When completing learning logs please encourage children to sound out words for themselves by using their Phonics knowledge.

There is an updated list of dates for Learning Logs to be completed and brought back to school.

<u>Reading</u>

Children continue to participate in 3 group practise reading sessions with an adult per week, as per the Little Wandle Scheme. The book is matched with your child's phonics knowledge and tricky words. The book that has been read that week will be sent home on a Thursday. This will enable the child to become more familiar, fluent, and confident and show understanding of what they have read. <u>Please ensure your</u> child has their book in school every day.

I would encourage you to help the progression of your child's reading by asking them questions about the book regularly i.e.: discussing the characters, setting, feelings, asking them to show expression, prediction of what might happen next, did they like the ending, what would they choose for an alternative ending? You could also use the questions at the back of the book.

An exciting <u>reminder</u> that the children earn a star towards a reading reward every time they read their school reading book <u>three or more times per week at home</u>. Once they have gained six stars, they will choose a reading reward gift. Please write any comments or sign to show they have read at home. They can read 2-4 pages a day, rather than the whole book in one session.

<u>Helicopter Stories</u>

As part of the Communication and Language Area of Learning, we are now introducing Helicopter stories whereby your child, in a group, will create their own story through drawing pictures of a character and setting/s, scribe (with support of the adult) and read/act out to the rest of the class. This will also support their development in Literacy, PSED, Physical Development and Expressive Arts and Design. This will be on an alternative weekly basis alongside Learning Logs.
