

Literacy:

The children will continue to develop their understanding of poetry and explore key themes such as rhyme, rhythm and repetition creating their own Haiku's. We will focus on the story of Ronald the Rhino and delve deeper into the key themes and characters. Children will explore persuasive writing, taking part in role play debates and using this in their own writing to persuade people to 'Save the Rhinos'. Children will develop their skills in letter writing and its key features, writing their own letter to Greenpeace.

ICT:

Music:

Your Imagination – We are learning to perform the song, find the beat of the song and recognise the sounds of different musical instruments.



Art / DT:

In art we will be exploring different animal patterns and traditional art styles from all over the world using different materials.

In DT we will be investigating a variety of vehicles and their features, learning about wheels, axles and chassis. They will create, decorate and design a vehicle.

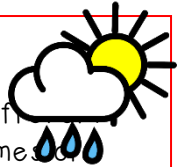
Maths:

The children will be exploring multiplication and division as well as fractions this term. They will be learning about position and direction. We will then be focusing on building confidence with numbers to 100, reading, writing and counting in multiples of two, five and ten. The children will be learning to recognise and know the value of different denominations of coins and notes. They then will learn about time.

Science:

Animals - Children will be exploring different types of animals and learning the names of these. The children will then be able to group and sort animals by their features. We will then learn about keeping animals as pets and go on to learn about their diets.

Wonderful Weather - The children will be learning all about weather, looking at weather forecasts and videoing their own school weather forecasts. They will be making weather observations and make collages about the seasons.
